GOSPEL-- St. Matthew 9:1 - 8

At that time, getting into a boat Jesus crossed over and came to his own city. And behold, they brought to him a paralytic, lying on his bed; and when Jesus saw their faith he said to the paralytic, "Take heart, my son; your sins are forgiven." And behold, some of the scribes said to themselves, "This man is blaspheming." But Jesus, seeing their thoughts, said, "Why do you think evil in your hearts? For which is easier, to say 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say 'Rise and walk?' But that you may know that the Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins," he then said to the paralytic — "Rise, take up your bed and go home." And he they were afraid, and they glorified God, who had given such authority to men.

HONORING THE HOLY THEOTOKOS OVER THE 15 DAYS OF AUGUST

The 15-day Fasting season, beginning on August 1st is held in honor of the Dormition ("the falling asleep in the Lord) of the Theotokos. At the time when the Holy Theotokos fell asleep in the Lord (August 15th), except for the Apostle Thomas, all of the Apostles including the Apostle Paul were gathered together at Her bedside. Apostolic Tradition verifies that, at the moment of Her physical death, Jesus Christ himself descended and carried Her soul into heaven. Following Her repose, the body of the Theotokos was taken in procession and laid in a tomb near the Garden of Gethsemane. When the Apostle Thomas arrived three days after Her repose and desired to see Her body, the tomb was found to be empty. The bodily assumption of the Theotokos was confirmed by the message of an angel and by her appearance to the Apostles.
