- 1. Please remain standing while following the directions of our ushers.
- 2. Ladies, kindly remove lipstick before receiving.
- 3. When receiving Holy Communion, make the Sign of the Cross, state your name (baptismal name), and naturally receive as if being fed.
- 4. Non-Orthodox Christians may not receive Holy Communion, but they may receive the Holy Bread at the end of the service.
- 5. All Orthodox Christians must be spiritually prepared to receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Please see the priest if you have any questions.

PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes" of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE—Romans 15:1-7: Brethren, we who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves; let each you believe that I am able to do this?" They of us please his neighbor for his good, to edify him. For Christ did not please himself; but, as it is written, "The reproaches of those who reproached thee fell on me." For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Welcome one another, therefore, as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.

GOSPEL- St. Matthew 9: 27-35: At that time, as Jesus passed by, two blind men followed him, crying aloud, "Have mercy on us, Son of

David." When he entered the house, the blind men came to him; and Jesus said to them, "Do said to him, "Yes, Lord." Then he touched their eyes, saying, "According to your faith be it done to you." And their eyes were opened. And Jesus sternly charged them, "See that no one knows it." But they went away and spread his fame through all that district. As they were going away, behold, a dumb demoniac was brought to him. And when the demon had been cast out, the dumb man spoke; and the crowds marveled, saying, "Never was anything like this seen in Israel." But the Pharisees said, "He casts out demons by the prince of demons." And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every disease and every infirmity among the people.

CHRISTIAN LIFE IN THE WORLD – In today's passage from St. Paul's Epistle to the Romans (15:1-7) we hear that we are to minister to one another so as to glorify God and to acquire our own salvation, as well as that of others. Imitating Christ in terms of sacrificing ourselves in applying the virtues of endurance and patience for the benefit of others is the main message. This message had an element that the ancient Romans and Greeks had not comprehended before. "Both Epicurean and Stoic philosophers believed that fulfillment could be achieved in this life through emotional calm and impassivity. However, they pursued this aim differently. The Epicureans pursued pleasure, while the Stoics renounced it." (Orthodox Study Bible, pg. 1501). Much of modern thinking resembles Epicurean and Stoic thinking, which often clashes with the Christ-like mentality of sacrificial love. Seeking fulfillment only for this present life is in itself a dead-end. A truly fulfilled life is lived in Christ, Who resurrected from the dead; forgives us of our sins and raises us up to live with Him in His Eternal Kingdom. +FR. THEODORE

- **4) Kontakion:** "You were transfigured upon the mount, O Christ our God, and Your disciples, in so far as they could bear, beheld Your glory. Thus, when they see You crucified, they may understand Your voluntary passion, and proclaim to the world that You are truly the effulgence of the Father." / Επί του ὁρους μετεμορφώθης...

This machine will be set up for self service of **Stewardship**, **Candles**, **Sunday School Donations**, **Endowment**, and **General Giving**.


