THE LADDER ALL SAINTS SUNDAY; SYNAXIS OF THE 12 APOSTLES



PRAYER FOR READING HOLY SCRIPTURES

"Shine within our hearts, loving Master, the pure light of Your divine knowledge and open the eyes of our minds that we may comprehend the message of Your Gospel. Instill in us, also, reverence for Your blessed commandments, so that having conquered sinful desires, we may pursue a spiritual life, thinking and doing all these things that are pleasing to You. For You are the Light of our souls and bodies and to You we give glory together with Your Father Who is without beginning and Your all-holy, good, and life-giving Spirit, now and forever and to the ages of ages. Amen."

EPISTLE—Hebrews 11:33 - 40; 12:1 - 2

Brethren, all the saints through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were tempted, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated — of whom the world was not worthy — wandering over deserts and mountains and in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect. Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin that easily distracts, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the

pioneer and perfecter of faith.

GOSPEL— St. Matthew 9:36 – 38; 10:1 – 8

At that time, when Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." And he called to him his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every infirmity. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Lebbaeus called Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him. These twelve Jesus sent out, charging them, "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And preach as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without paying, give without pay."

Today we commemorate the Holy Apostles: St. Peter, St. Andrew (the First-Called), Sts. James and John (the sons of Zebedee), St. Philip, St. Bartholomew, St. Thomas, St. Matthew (the tax-collector), St. James (the son of Alphaeus), St. Simon "the Zealot," St. Jude, St. Matthias (who was elected as successor to Judas Iscariot, who betrayed the Lord and then hanged himself). St. Paul became an Apostle following his encounter with Christ on the road to Damascus.

Liturgical Notes

- 1) Entrance with the Holy Gospel: "O merciful One, You came from on high, and condescended to Your three-day burial to save us from passions. You are our life and our Resurrection, O Lord, glory to You."/Εξ ὑψους κατήλθες...
- 2) "O holy Apostles, intercede to merciful God that He may grant our souls forgiveness of sins."/Απόστολοι άγιοι πρεσβεύσατε...[Hymn for the Holy Apostles]
- 3) "Your Church, O Christ our God, clothed itself in the blood of Your martyrs from throughout the world, as though it were a robe of linen and purple; through them, she cries out to You, 'Send down upon Your people compassion, grant peace to Your commonwealth and, to our souls, great mercy."/Των εν ὁλω τω κόσμω Μαρτύρων Σου...[Hymn for All Saints Sunday]
- 4) "Since You are a deliverer of captives and a protector of the poor; a physician for the sick; a noble attendant to kings, O Great among the martyrs and glorious George, intercede with Christ God that He may save our souls."/Ως των αιχμαλώτων ελευθερωτής...[Hymn for St. George]
- 5) Kontakion: "The world offers You, the Author of all creation, as the first-fruits of nature, the God-bearing martyrs. O most merciful, by their intercessions, through the Theotokos, maintain Your Church in perfect peace."/Ως απαρχάς της φύσεως...

SPIRITUAL THOUGHT — Today is the Sunday following Pentecost as it is known as "All-Saints Sunday." In his Epistle to the Hebrews, St. Paul writes, "Surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us." (Hebrews 12:1). "The cloud of witnesses includes…the saints and martyrs of the Lord in all ages. If they made it, so can we. We persevere by getting rid of **sin**, the **weight** of which keeps us from heeding the truth; setting as our destination the heavenly city, running **the race** of faith; and keeping our attention focused on Jesus Christ our Lord and King (Hebrews 12:2). This race is not a sprint, but a marathon of **endurance**: it does not end until we fully enter the age to come (See 1 Corinthians 9:24-27)." (Orthodox Study Bible, pg. 1668).
